- 4. Explain why China, India, and other Asian countries account for over threequarters of the global cotton fabric production, but considerably less of the production of finished clothing, like men's and boy's trousers.
- 5. What are the criteria that may help determine the selection of a specific site for the following industries?
 - a. Aluminum industry
 - b. German automobile manufacturer (BMW, Mercedez-Benz, Volkswagen)
 - c. Apple Computer Software division
